Dear President, Dear Colleagues,

The IJF Academy was established in 2013, on the wish of our President Mr Marius Vizer, to serve as the teaching arm of the IJF. To ensure the highest standard, we partnered with one of the best Universities to certify our academic courses, the University of Physical Education of Budapest. Today we have 1,700 Alumni of the IJF Academy, qualifying from 126 countries, members of the IJF.

We have paid all our attention to ensure that our product is always the best on offer. We also paid attention to keep upgrading our products and services. On the 27th August 2018, the IJF Academy Foundation was granted a Higher Education Teaching License by the (NCFHE) National Commission for Further and Higher Education. NCFHE is an affiliate member of ENQA, the European Association for Quality Assurance in Higher Education. The Qualifications Recognition Information Centre (QRIC) within NCFHE also forms part of the European Network of Information Centres in the European Region (ENIC) and the National Recognition Information Centres in the European Union (NARIC). The Commission also acts as the National Contact Point for the European Qualifications Framework.

All these coaches and administrators involved in these projects require professional academic qualification to be able to interact with third party organisations, Schools, Government Entities, Local Councils, Sports Centres etc. The Judo Professional today is not enough that he qualifies for his National Federation they require a professional qualification.

**We will start again the Undergraduate Diploma in Judo Management (60 Credits) on 10<sup>th</sup> of August 2020. We attach the information for this management.**

**We will also launch the Undergraduate Certificate Judo Instructor (UCJI) on 10<sup>th</sup> of August 2020. All the previous qualifications obtained by graduated students will remain valid, but those students who want to upgrade to the newly accredited courses can apply for the online-only courses only and obtain the Undergraduate Certificate Judo Instructor (30 credits). New applicants without any previous qualifications need to apply for both the online and practical. The UCJI course will be available in English, French, Russian and Spanish languages.**

We will receive applications for these courses up to the **31<sup>st</sup> of July 2020**. Please use the enclosed applications. Send them to [info@ijf.edu.mt](mailto:info@ijf.edu.mt) in **WORD FORMAT**.

As of 2020, the IJF has decided that there will be a fee for these new accredited courses. The fees will be:

1. Upgrade to the new Undergraduate Certificate Judo Instructor course - 1 semester 30 credits (only online); **550 USD**
2. New Undergraduate Certificate Judo Instructor 1 - semester 30 credits; **900 USD**.  
This fee does not include the participation cost of the practical session! Flights and cost of board and accommodation are to be covered by the students or Federation. As these are accredited courses, we suggest you seek support from your Sports Ministry, Sports Councils and National Olympic Committees. **Practical sessions for the UCJI courses will be organised in 2021.**
